Tena koutou katoa

It's over three months since the last newsletter, so there's quite a bit of news, especially as plans for commemorations are now actively underway, not just in Aotearoa, but also in Tasmania and the Netherlands, and we are now in contact with other groups and working towards making each other's plans known.

Newsletters will be more frequent from now on. Please send any items of news, especially plans you have for events this year!

You will notice that the name for the 2017 commemoration is now slightly different and more appropriate: **First Encounter 375**. This also fits with the example set by central government for marking the 250th anniversary of James Cook's first voyage in 2019 ("First Encounters 250").

1 "First Encounter 375" (FE 375) logo launched:

We appreciate the support of Manawhenua ki Mohua and artist Robin Slow for the design of this year's special logo, which is part of the signature at the end of this message. The te reo (Maori language) wording translated is "Commemoration 375". Here is Robin Slow's description of the significance of the imagery:

- The two manu (bird) forms on either side represent Mohua and Tasman. Mohua is the name of Golden Bay and the name of a manu, and one of the stories that come through tell of a large white bird coming into the area (the ships with the 'flapping' of the sails)
- The manu have four koru, for the manawhenua plus three mata waka of the area.
- The putatara in the central portion describes the conflict between the land (mouthpiece) representing Tane and the sea (shell) representing Tangaroa, bound together by pingao the peace maker. The instrument was a feature in the communications between Tasman and the iwi. Hence the message it conveys.

2 Local FE 375 Planning Group established:

A small group has been established to coordinate local (Golden Bay/Mohua) events. Main groups represented are Manawhenua ki Mohua, the Golden Bay Museum, local researchers, art community, schools, the Department of Conservation and the Dutch community. The group met for the first time on 24 April and will meet again on 12 June.
